

## IMPORTANT NOTICE RE: BYLAW EXAMINATION

The Insurance Councils of Saskatchewan have the authority, under The Saskatchewan Insurance Act, to regulate insurance agents, agencies, adjusters and salespersons.

The rules regulating insurance agents, agencies, adjusters and salespersons are found within the Council 'Bylaws'.

The licence and education qualifications specific to each class of licence are identified in an addendum to the Bylaws called the 'Schedules'.

The Bylaws and Schedules together provide a complete outline of the privileges and obligations of an insurance agent, agency, adjuster or salesperson.

An applicant for an insurance licence must successfully pass a Bylaws Examination before being granted an insurance licence.

The Bylaw Examination consists of 40 questions including true/false, multiple choice, and matching type questions. You must get 30 correct answers (75%) in order to pass.

It is recommended that you read the entire Bylaws and Schedules prior to attempting the Bylaw Examination.

The Bylaws Examination will primarily focus on Bylaws that deal with the obligations and conduct of a licensed insurance agent, adjuster or salesperson.

Examination questions will be taken from the following Bylaws so make sure you have the most current copy available:

- Bylaw 2 – Licenses
- Bylaw 3 – Education requirements
- Bylaw 5 – Register and Licensing
- Bylaw 8 – Misconduct
- Bylaw 9 – Incompetence
